Service Animal Policy For All Boone Hall Special Events And Willie's Roadside Market

- Service Animals are defined as dogs that are individually trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities. This may also include miniature horses. No other animals qualify and will not be permitted.
- With respect to legitimate service animals, Boone Hall Farms and Willie's Roadside Market will strictly adhere to the following, in conjunction with the ADA and the State of South Carolina Attorney General's guidance:
 - Any animal whose task is to provide protection, emotional support, well-being, comfort, or companionship is not considered a service animal and WILL NOT be allowed on the grounds.
 - All service animals must remain by the handler's side at all times and must be harnessed, leashed, or tethered; unless these devices interfere with the service animal's work or the individual's disability prevents using these devices. In that case, the individual must maintain control of the animal through voice, signal, or other effective methods.
 - If the animal, at any time during their presence on the grounds, is not housetrained or acts up to include barking, biting, walking around or jumping on other patrons, direct removal of the animal will be enforced.
 - In compliance with DHEC regulations, service animals are not allowed in the petting zoo, at Willie's Roadside Market, or in our U-Pick fields.
- Please note that these policies are in effect for ALL Boone Hall Special Events and at Willie's Roadside Market and should not be confused with Boone Hall Plantation's pet policy for guests touring the Plantation and Gardens.
